The Yalda event has its roots in Zoroastrianism, the ancient religion of Persia. During Yalda, family and friends gather together, often in the homes of elders or grandparents, to commemorate the occasion. The centerpiece of the celebration is a special table known as the "Sofreh-e Yalda." This table is decorated with various symbolic items and traditional foods.
